INTRODUCTION

We started our long journey to eradicate Poverty, Ignorance and Apathy from a mud-hut in a village Atghara, Baduria Block, North 24 Parganas almost three decades ago.

We earned rich dividend in experience. Voluntary Sector very often works within an insular cocoon of their own. We are different.

There are many studies which have shown the relationship between T.B and Poverty. Data shows a positive correlation between Poverty and the Self –Reported prevalence of T.B in India. As per latest WHO estimates, about (2.2) million new cases and Three lakh (3) deaths are occurring annually in India. Thus, about three Lakh deaths are occurring annually in India. Thus, about three people are dying of T.B every five minutes.

It is estimated that 40% of the India population is infected i.e. four hundred (400) million people. Even with a conservative estimate of 10% risk, nearly (40) forty million (40) are likely to develop T.B in their life time.

Then, we have a great responsibility and greater challenge. Along with facing other problems. SEVA staff at a time, for hearing each other, absorbing, adjusting and readjusting to the idea of fighting PIA, have also to sensitize themselves of fighting all type of diseases. Our report reflexes this pledge, this commitment.

AGRICULTURE

In all our previous Annual Reports we have already referred to the crisis that the agricultural scenario in India is facing today. The future of agriculture is not being very hopeful for a country like ours, where the farmers are predominantly small and marginal or landless. Introduction of newer seed technologies are also a looming danger. We from our side are spearheading a number of initiatives to discuss the relevant issues in all the forums – be it policy makers or the implementers. Our activities will corroborate our ideas.

No tillage Crop Cultivation

Regular one hundred thirty six (136) women farmers from seven (7) villages practicing this method and producing various vegetable.

Relay Cropping Vegetables

Two or more vegetables are cultivated at the same time. We utilize the nutrition available from the soil at different levels. Forty Seven (47) Women farmers and 85 other farmers are practicing this method.

Relay Crop Field

In this method field crops like Jute, pulse, coriander or oil seeds are sown before the main crop of Aman paddy is harvested. This year one hundred sixty (167) farmers have adopted this method on 30.5 hectares of land and they got satisfactory result.

Nutritional Garden

This is similar to kitchen garden. One Hundred Sixteen women farmers have made nutritional gardens their home stead land of our Project area. The total area covered was 0.40 hectare and 1528.5 kg of vegetables were produced during Kharif and Rabi season, the market value of which was Rs. 13752/-.

This enabled the women farmers to augment their daily intake of vegetables in their normal meals. Some have also sold a part of it and obtained good pocket money.

Mixed Cropping of vegetables

Two or more vegetables are cultivated in same land in same time. Regularly Twenty Two (22) farmers do practice this method.

Greening India Programme

This Programme ensures plantation of various trees to increase the green covers on the land. Apart from mitigating the effects of climate change, these trees also help to augment the families' income. We have distributed 14154 nos of miscellaneous plants and 900 nos of fruit

plants among 109 farmer's family. Also we have Permanent Nursery at Vikas Kendra campus. This year we raise 6000 nos Lambu-Mehagini & 1500 nos of Rain tree at our own Permanent Nursery.

Vermi Compost:

Vermi Compost is an unique bio-fertilizer, ever, used in agriculture and famous for less input with maximum output formula. The existence of earth worm, which makes soil more fertile, gets hampered due to chemical toxicity in soil. Twenty One (21) farmers of three villages in making vermin-compost. So that they use it in cultivation properly. They produced 3541 kgs. of vermin compost worth Rs. 35410/- during the year. Our organic farmers Liakat Biswas and Nirapada Biswas got subsidy for vermin bed making from ADO, Baduria this year with the help of Vikas Kendra.

Organic Jute:

This is the 7th year of the programme. Jute happens to be a major crop for the farmers of West Bengal. Gunnies and other packing material made out of natural jute fibre started losing market in the face of synthetic alternatives. These had resulted in the decrease in the demand of nature fibre. All the concerned people were looking for avenues to obtain some value added items which could have wider acceptance from the consumer. Jute fibre produced organically i.e. not using any chemical fertilizers or poisonous insecticides commands a better price in the international market.

Central Research Institute for Jute & Allied Fibers (CRIJAF) has been very very helpful in formulating various strategies to alleviate the condition of Jute farmers in West Bengal. CRIJAF had put us in touch with Ganges Jute Pvt. Ltd who acted as our private industry partner in carrying out organic Jute initiative. Vikas Kendra has organized some training programme with the help of CRIJAF is given bellow:-

Vikas Kendra developed some Indigenous Technology for the preparation of liquid manure for application on the crops, botanical pesticides for the control of pest and disease. Those are eco-friendly.

We have showed a documentary film on the above subject.

Adolescent Nutrition:

We have organised a Adolescent's meeting cum Health Camp regarding Adolescent Nutrition. Dr. Pranab Kumar Chowdhury, (DMS, Cal) facilitated this programme and Checked up Adolescent's health and gave some Homeopathy medicines.

Strengthening Community Groups:

We have organised a meeting on Strengthening Community Groups for monitoring local health system. Mr. Bhashkar Chakraborty, CDPO, Baduria ICDS Project, has discussed importance role of community groups for sustainability of Anganwadi Centre and ensuring nutrition of child.

Home Visit:

We have completed 1200 nos. of home visits for promotion of Integrated Management of Neo-Natal and Childhood Illness (IMNCI), i.e. Breast Feeding, Diarrhoea etc. At the time of home visit we have also discussion with mothers regarding Nutritious Food, Personal Health & Hygiene and Sanitation.

Homeopathy Clinic:

Vikas Kendra rendering health services to community people through Dr. Arun Sen Memorial Health Clinic. Dr. Pranab Chowdhury, DMS, treated 1271 nos. of patient. Details are given below:

SISHU VIKAS KENDRA

The objective of Sishu Vikas Kendra (SVK) is to impart pre-primary education to the distressed rural children and upgrade them mentally and be able to sustain educational pressure for the next higher classes.

After completing pre-primary education, we take them for admission in the nearest primary school and private missionary schools. This year 5 children were enrolled in the local primary school.

We took up the work of Child Development Centre not as a base point of education but as the platform to start with building mental set up to hold basic responsibilities. Keeping it in point of view, our teachers are advised in taking care of SVK children and they are doing their best in doing so and at the same time developing hearty relationship between local youth and our centre's. They arrange monthly meeting with the mothers and also other programmes for them.

Guardian Meeting:

Monthly meeting of guardians with the guardians of SVK children is a very important step in this direction. During this year 12 guardian meeting took place in our SVK Centre. Subjects discussed in the meetings were on Child Care, Food & Nutrition, Kitchen Garden, Family Planning, Immunization, Discipline, First Aid, Utility of Medicinal Plants, Importance of Cleanliness and Child Education. The main purpose of such visits was to ensure regular attendance of children in school and to have personal interaction with the mothers to share their family problems, discussion on improvement of health, ailments and the remedies with the family members.

Games and sports play important role in the making body and mind healthy to every human being. We organize annual sports every year for our SVK children and associate members. This year the event took place at Centre SVK on 28th January'2014. SVKs current and ex-students, their mothers and the committee members participated in the sports events.

Annual Picnic:

All the SVK children along with the teachers participated in the annual picnic held in 28th December'2013. Mothers and committee members also joined the happy occasion. The programme was a source of fun, joy and a feeling of togetherness for the children.

Observation of Memorable Days:

Days of National importance and relevance in our life, Independence Day, Republic Day, Netaji's Birth Day, Rabindranath Tagore's Birth Day and Rakhi Bandhan Day were celebrated with great honour and respect.

WOMEN HELP LINE

The Central Government has introduced Help Line or Help Phone in West Bengal to assist the helpless and endangered women.

Help Line has been introduced in „Kolkata“ & its surrounding areas also. If women are in danger on the road this phone may be of great help to them. The people of voluntary organization will come forward to help the endangered & helpless women if the scheduled numbers are dialed. The arrangement for taking legal action by law & the police will also be available in this regard & all the expenditure is borne by the Human Resource Development Department of the Govt. of India. The Help Line numbers of the voluntary organisation are 10921, 10922, 10923, 10924, 10925 & 10926. The Help Line number of Kolkata Police is 1091. Women Help Line services started at Vikas Kendra from April 2004, with the toll free number of 10926. The Department of Human Resource Development has directed to handle cautiously, each case in the village area & they are also under the women Help Line scheme. The following issues are under the case of the Department of HRD of Govt. of India.

- *Any disturbance on road during travelling.*
- *Victim of Deprivation.*
- *Emotional problem.*
- *Social oppression.*
- *Accidental cause in family.*
- *Driven away from family relatives.*
- *Forceful Divorce.*
- *Inability in returning to family after being released from imprisonment.*
- *Become homeless due to natural calamity.*
- *Forced to be engaged in sexual activities illegally.*
- *Sexually tortured or abuse.*
- *Without getting any help from family & victim of tension.*

- *Mentally handicapped / retarded.*

Help Line Work Methodology:

- Help Line team believes that every person in need who contacts them is important. A woman may call the centre just to ventilate or for any kind of immediate help. Thus each call needs to be attended with due care.
- Help Line is a participatory intervention process of finding solution to individual problems & solutions must not be imposed upon the clients.
- Help Line is a strategy to network with other organizations in order to provide required help to the needy.
- Follow-up is done by making regular calls to referral organization to review the case & by involving allied organizations for keeping personal contact.
- Regular contact is maintained with telephone department to ensure that the telephone lines are in order.
- Regular meetings are organized with resource organizations for updating the date bank for referral services.
- Documentation on the experience of the Help Line.

It is to be ensured that appropriate level of confidentiality is maintained in each case.

The women Help Line was established in April 2004. The Toll Free Phone Number in Habra Telephone Exchange is 10926 & other is (not toll free) 03216-220635.

This Women Help Line at present is consisting of two members & their service is available for round the clock. The name of Help Line Counselor is Ms.Shabari Sanyal (M.S.W.),

Despite tremendous pressure on our limited fund, SEVA of its own is funding the Help Line presently, realizing the positive impact the Help Line.

During the year 2013-2014 we have got 59 cases out of these, 32 cases we have been able to close by reconciliation, 10 cases were referred to Legal Aid, 4 cases were referred to Police Station, 2 case referred to Short Stay Home & 3 cases were closed by Mutual Divorce..

We are giving vocational trainings for rehabilitation purpose like Tailoring, Hand Embroidery, Nursing Training, Food Processing, Mat Binding, Art & Craft, and Bodi Making etc.

Children's are going to Sishu Vikas Kendra & Local F.P. School and Adolescents girls are going to Local High School.

DHARMAGOLA

Dharmagola is community grain storage, it was established in 1990. The concept of Dharmagola is "To Stop Distress Sale". When Marginal Farmers & Small Farmers are producing grain in their own field, at the same time they bring huge production in the market. Then market price goes down and middle men take opportunity. To Stop Distress Sale we purchase the grain in that time at market price, from marginal & small Farmers. It is under Atghara Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited.

Vikas Kendra came in existence in 1985, during first years in fighting Poverty, Ignorance and Apathy; a realization came to build a Dharmogola. It is an old concept to make a common warehouse based on trust and ethics. The concept was to when the price will go down the village products to be purchase by Dharmagola, when it will go up products to be sold with a better price. Profit will plough back to the producers. It is under supervision of Atghara Vikas Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited.

This year we have purchased 21823.5 kgs. of Paddy (12698.5 kgs. Boro & 9125 kgs. Aman). We have sold Paddy and got profit Rs. 20034/-. 50% of the profit amount i.e. Rs. 10017/- we have already distributed among farmers.

Atghara Vikas Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited got the registration dated 13.03.2013 from ARCS office it is under Cooperative Society Registration act.

We have started a Grocery Shop from November'2013. Our Co-operative is gradually gaining ground. Sales figure is increasing, month by month.

MANAB JAMIN**[A Project of SEVA]**

Manab Jamin project has now completed sixteen years of its service in Bolpur-Sriniketan Block of Birbhum District of West Bengal. Manab Jamin is working in 3 blocks of Bolpur Sub-Division under Birbhum District. These are Bolpur-Sriniketan Block, Illambazar Block and Labpur Block. The Project area are rain fed mono-crop area. Manab Jamin project is located in the arid zone of West Bengal. The soil is Red Laterite along with Vindhya-alluvial soil at places. The landscape is undulating. It rained when it was not expected and did not rain when it was expected. The temperature was very high during the summer months. The winter was mild but had severe

cold. Occasionally Soil erosion is very high. Manab Jamin is working for the Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and under privileges section people of the community.

Commercial Vegetable Cultivation organically by SHG women

This is one of the income generation programmes for the SHG women. The SHG women have been trained on vegetable cultivation organically. The women sold their product at local market. During this year, Manab Jamin had organized 2 nos. of trainings on vegetable cultivation organically by SHG women where 25 women of 4 SHG participated. 5 women of 2 SHG namely Hopon Buru of Paruldanga and Kalimata at Kankutia under Manab Jamin Project area implemented this programme. Hopon Buru SHG of Paruldanga had cultivated at the bank of Mayurakshi Canal and Kalimata SHG of Kankutia had cultivated at the waste land.

Promotion of Kitchen Garden

This is one of the popular programmes of Manab Jamin where the women of had demonstrated this programme. The main thrust of this programme is to propagate the home stead kitchen garden which would be source of nutritional supply of the family as well as secondary source of earning the pocket money. This year, Manab Jamin supplied seed and seedling in three times in a year that is in rainy, winter and summer season. The women have used only organic manure and homemade organic pesticides. During this year 242 numbers of women have demonstrated the kitchen garden programme in 11 villages and 7 types of seeds had been distributed to promote the kitchen garden. The production of vegetable has enriched their diet. In some cases they have earn some money by selling a part of the extra production.

Turmeric Demonstration programme

This is one of the important programmes for Women of Manab Jamin Project area. To encourage the village women, turmeric cultivation programme was under taken during this year.102 kg of turmeric seed had been distributed among 51 farmers and SHG members of 7 villages under Manab Jamin project area. Each farmer has received 2 kg of turmeric seed.

Papaya Seedling Distribution

To support food and nutrition of the people of economically weaker section papaya seedlings had been raised. During this year 2000 papaya seedling had been raised at the Manab Jamin campus. It had been distributed among the members of Eco group, SHG members, villagers etc.

Back yard Orchard

This is one of the popular programmes of Manab Jamin. Every year, Manab Jamin has distributed fruit trees among the villagers of Manab Jamin. These were distributed to the villagers from its inception. The main motto of this programme is to increase fruit plant population and develop the green area as well as to improve the nutritional status of the villagers. During this year Manab Jamin has distributed 1318 no of fruit trees among the villagers of MJ project area. The details are given below:-

Greening India Programme

This programme supported by the Japanese Business Community and Facilitated by Tagore Society for Rural Development. The objective of this programme is to create awareness and demonstration among the villagers on the need for plantation for trees and increase plant population & green area. During this year we distributed 3475 seedlings mainly fruit plants in 12 villages. It's covered 9.66 ha of land.

Support of International Centre for Agricultural Research in Dry land Areas

During this year, Manab Jamin had distributed the special variety of lentil seed (Certified, Foundation, Breeders) among the farmers of Manab Jamin Project area. The idea of this programme is to reduce malnutrition as well as to improve the economic condition of the farmers through the cultivation of lentil cultivation. It is also to reduce the labour migration and improve the soil fertility. Manab Jamin had got support from International Centre for Agricultural research in Dry land Areas (ICARDA) to implement this programme. This year, 2532 kg of special Variety Breeder, Foundation and Certified seeds were distributed among 565 farmers of 40 villages under Bolpur-Sriniketan Development Block and Illambazar Development Block of Birbhum Districts. Farmers got special variety of lentil seeds (Subrata, Moitree, HUL 57 and PL 6) .

Manab Jamin had organized several trainings and farmers field School programmes at different villages where an agricultural expert was present. The farmers have shared their views and ideas through Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) in this programme.

Consumer Protection Right through a Street Corner

Manab Jamin organized awareness meetings on Consumer Protection Rights at the different villages under Manab Jamin project Area through a street corner with the help of Consumer Affairs and Fair Business Practices, Birbhum Regional Office, Suri on 22nd May, 2013. Posters were displayed. A Cartoon Documentary Film regarding different examples of buying day to day commodities from market was shown. A seminar was also organized on Consumer Rights and its Protection. The programme got in touch with nearly 1000 consumers who are yet to know of their Rights. They moreover learnt the signs and the procedures of checking expiry date marks etc. before buying it through this important programme.

Special Programme on Consumer Right

A special seminar was organized on consumer awareness at the auditorium of Gitanjali with the help of Consumer affairs and fair business practice, Birbhum Regional Office, Suri Birbhum on 24th May 2013. 200 villagers of Manab Jamin project area, members of different NGOs and CBOs and different dignitary personalities participated in this programme. The Deputy Assistant Director of CA& FBP, Consumer Welfare Officer, and Senior Technical Officer of BSNL, District Officer of Small Savings of Malda and Legal Meteorology Officer had participated in this programme.

Movement of Tableau for consumer awareness throughout the District

This year, Bolpur Manab Jamin had moved out a tableau for consumer awareness with the support of Consumer Affairs and Fair Business Practice, Birbhum Regional Office, Suri, Birbhum. This tableau is meant to reach all the sub-divisions along with Block and few Gram panchayets of this district. This tableau consists of banners Which create awareness among the consumers on every purchase with an announcement of the rights of the consumer and its protection, This tableau moved from 20th to 27th of May, 2013.

Consumer Awareness in Pous Mela

Pous Mela is an Annual Fair and Festival that take place in Santiniketan. The Fair is held for four days. This year, Manab Jamin had organized a Stall at Pous Mela for 4 days from 23rd December to 26th December 2013, in collaboration with Consumer Affairs and Fair Business Practice, Birbhum Regional Office, Suri, Birbhum created awareness among the consumer's on their rights. The Stall was inaugurated by Prof. Gopal Chandra De, Principal, Palli Siksha Bhavana, Visva Bharati University and Mr. Biswanath Bag was present at the time of inauguration. Various cartoons related to consumer rights were exhibited and a documentary film of the said department was shown. Manab Jamin throughout this fair had aimed to create awareness about the rights guaranteed to consumers under the law and to serve as Guidance Agency to guide consumers to assert such rights.

Consumer Outreach Programme

This year, Manab Jamin had organized a daylong consumer outreach programme with the support of Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) in association with consumer Affairs and Fair Business Practices. The objective of this programme was to create awareness among the consumers about various measures of TRAI to protect the interests of telecom and cable & broadcasting sectors. This is also intended to provide a platform for direct interaction among consumers, service providers and other stakeholder. This programme was held on 9th January, 2014 at Gitanjali Auditorium. 250 villagers along many dignitaries had participated in this programme

Social Security Programme For Unorganized Sector

Manab Jamin is involved for the development of unorganized sector labour through the scheme of West Bengal Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare.

The building and other construction workers in the age group of 18 to 60 years and have worked for not less than ninety days in the subsequent one year are eligible for registration as a beneficiary under this Scheme. Annually contributions of Rs.30/-is to be deposited along with relevant documents against which a receipt will be issued by the office and an equal amount has been released by the Government as Matching Contribution.

In the year 2013-14, 136 villagers under 10 villages were benefited by the scheme of WBBOCWW. All identity cards and pass books of the registered beneficiaries under WBBOCWW have been distributed

Under the scheme of WBBOCWW, this year 48 beneficiaries got the support for purchasing tools and 14 beneficiaries got assistance for education for their children for further studies of Higher Secondary and Graduation standard.

Manab Jamin has also facilitated the social assistance schemes for the benefit of unorganized sector labour with the help of Labour Department, Govt. of West Bengal. The name of the Scheme is State Assistant Scheme for Provision of Future (SASPFU). The subscribers who are involved in the self employment occupation and work at unorganized industries may get the benefit from this scheme. Through this scheme, the subscriber deposits Rs. 25/ month and the amount of Rs.30/ has been released by the Government as matching contribution.

During 2013-14,156 villagers under 10 villages benefited by the scheme of SUSPFW. All required identity cards of the registered beneficiaries under SUSPFW have been given.

For the benefit of unorganized workers engaged in automobiles Manab Jamin implemented the scheme of West Bengal Transport Workers Social Security Scheme through West Bengal State Social Security Board, Labour Department, Govt. of West Bengal. The scheme shall apply to all unorganised workers engaged in automobiles used for commercial purposes namely cars,

taxies, luxury taxies, light commercial vehicles, vans, auto-rickshaws, tempos, lorries, trucks, bus, etc or by whatever name they are called, other than those solely owned by an individual for his personal or family use. This year 11 beneficiaries got the benefit of the scheme.

Awareness programme on Quality of Life for unorganized sector labour

Two nos. of awareness programmes of 2 daylong each on Quality of Life for unorganized sector labour had been organized with the help of Central Board of Worker's Education Centre, Asansol Regional Office at two villages under Manab Jamin project area. Assistant Labour Commissioner, Industrial Development Officer and Inspector, BCW spoke on different schemes, programmes and policies for their socio-economic development as well as the morality of their own life. The training programme was of 2 days each and the participants of the training were pair of husband and wife. There were 20 couples to participate in this training programme. Every participant got a stipend to participate in the training programme.

Awareness programme on Quality of Life for unorganized sector labour

One awareness programme of 4 daylong, on Quality of Life for unorganized sector labour had been organized with the help of Central Board of Worker's Education Centre, Asansol Regional Office at two villages under Manab Jamin project area. Assistant Labour Commissioner, Assistant Director CA&FBP, Industrial Development Officer and Inspector-BCW spoke on different schemes, programmes and policies for their socio-economic development as well as the morality of their own life. The training programme was of 4 days duration and the participants of the training were pair of husband and wife . There were 20 couples to participate in this training programme. Every participant got a stipend to participate the training programme.

Awareness programme on Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act

Five nos. of awareness programme on Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act had been organized with the help of Central Board of Worker's Education Centre, Asansol Regional Office at two villages under Manab Jamin Project area. Assistant Labour Commissioner, Industrial Development Officer, Assistant Director Agriculture, Social Audit Coordinator, MGNREGA Cell of Bolpur-Sriniketan Block spoke on different schemes, programmes and policies for their socio-economic development. The participants became enriched with the act and policies of MGNREGA

Sensitization programme for parents of Child Labour(Under NCLP special School)

During this year, one no of sensitization programme had been organized for the parents of child labour with the support of Central Board for Worker's Education, Asansol Regional Office for the parents of Child Labour Under National Child Labour Programme at NCLP Hansra School. The Field Officer of NCLP, Birbhum and Minimum Wages Inspector of Illambazar Block had Spoke on the Importance of the school. There had been also discussion on the availability & accessibility of different Schemes and programme for unorganized sector labour.

Special Awareness programme for Schedule Tribe Unorganised Sector Labour

Special programme for Scheduled Tribe had been organised with the support of Central Board for Worker's Education, Asansol Regional Office at different villages of Bolpur-Sriniketan Block. The objectives of this programme was to make a bridge between the under privileged section of the community and Government offices. Assistant Labour Commissioner, of Bolpur Regional Office, Assistant labour Commissioner of Bolpur-Sriniketan Block, Assistant Director CA&FBP,

Industrial Development Officer and Inspector-BCW spoke on different schemes, they also discussed on the availability & accessibility of different Schemes and programme for unorganized sector labour. 280 nos. of Tribal people among 7 villages had participated in this programme

Training on Health Awareness

This is the programme for the women. The idea of this programme is to create awareness among the women on health, hygiene, sanitation, family planning, immunization, nutrition, etc. The Health- In-charge conducted 17 nos. of health awareness meetings at twelve different villages under Manab Jamin project area, where 183 women have participated. There have been discussions on how to combat population explosion, immunization, child health care, combat malnutrition, improvement of health and hygiene, etc.

Training on Medicinal Plants

During this year 16 nos. of training had been organized on use of medicinal plants in 10 villages where 159 nos. of women have participated. Through participation of this programme the women have acquired some knowledge on use of locally available medicinal plants for prevention of primary illness. After this training, the rates of use of medicinal plants have improved.

Amla Campaign Programme

This Year, Manab Jamin had got the responsibility from the West Bengal State Medicinal Plant Board regarding the Amla campaign throughout the Birbhum District. The main idea of this programme is to create awareness on consumption of Amla as well as increase the population of Amla Plants through plantation. So the programme went well for the students of High school, Anganwadi workers, and the villagers through the fair.

Amla Campaign Programme at School

Though the idea of the programme is to create awareness on consumption of Amla as well as increase the Amla trees through plantation, So, The awareness programme was organised for the students of Schools for plantation of Amla plant in the community.

During this year, Manab Jamin had organized the awareness programme among the School Students of Bolpur Sub-Division and Rampurhat Sub-Division. The 1st Awareness programme was held on 8th November, 2013 at Duria E. A. High School under Rampurhat Sub-Division where 114 students of 15 schools had participated in this programme and the second one was held on 12th November, 2013 at Banga Bhavan for the student of Bolpur sub-Division where 150 students, teacher, Guest and other dignitaries' person were present.

Every School Awareness programme was divided in two sessions. In the 1st session, there was a Sit & Draw Competition on "*Amlaki Khan, Sustha Thakun*". The Student of Class VI to Class VIII had participated in this programme. Afterwards, there was discussion about the consumption as well as plantation of Amlaki.

At the end of the programme, Manab Jamin have distributed Amlaki Saplings among the students. Beside this, every school also got 200 no of Amlaki saplings to distribute among the students to increase the population of Amla plants in the community and a poster on "*Eat Amla, Be Healthy*" in every school.

Capacity Building Programme for Anganwadi Workers

This year, capacity building programmes had been organized for the Anganwadi Workers of Raipur-Supur Gram Panchayet under Amla Campaign Programme. The idea of this programme is to increase of consumption habit of the people. There had been discussion on usefulness of Amlaki. A specialist Ayurvedic Doctor had spoke on the different use of Amlaki. At the end of the programme, every participant got 2 nos. of Amlaki saplings to increase population of Amla plants.

Fair Under Amla Campaign programme

As a part of Amla campaign programme, day long Fair was organized at Manab Jamin Mirzapur Campus on 1st December, 2013 where SHG members, Eco group members were present there. A specialist Ayurvedic Doctor spoke on the different use of Amlaki. They had been shown various value added production for increase the habit on consumption of Amla. Few other NGO had also displayed their production. Nearly, 450 people assembled there. At the end of the programme, Amlaki saplings had been distributed among all the participants attended this fair to increase the population of Amla Plant

Value Addition programme Under Amla Campaign Programme

This is a programme for the SHG women. The idea of this programme was to prepare value added product from Amlaki for increase the habit of consumption pattern from value added product of Amlaki. Generally people have no knowledge on preparation of food item i.e. pickles, jam, juice, morabba, chwanpras etc. from Amlaki, So the participants will acquire the knowledge of food processing specially on Amlaki which will be help them for their income generation programme in future.

This year, Manab Jamin had organized the training programme in 4 batches of 5-days programme for the SHG members supported by Manab Jamin as well as Panchayets under Raipur –Supur Gram Panchayet and Anganwadi workers. Every Batch was consisted of 25 no of women and participated in this training programme

Social Mobilization and Service Delivery programme for Kala-Azar Elimination

Kala Azar has been a major public health concern in West Bengal. This disease is mostly prevalent in hard core endemic pockets inhabited predominantly by poor rural populations including the Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Castes, and other marginalized communities, who have relatively limited access to quality health care, communication and other basic facilities, and are thus rather vulnerable.

Manab Jamin and West Bengal Voluntary Health Association partnership is a key supportive programme strategy aiming at reaching the entire target population with correct information and services on effective VBD control/ elimination tools and technologies at Birbhum. In this background, the present project is providing effective and high quality technical and management services to plan and implement social mobilization and delivery of timely and appropriate preventive and curative service for Kala-Azar elimination in identified endemic areas. Manab Jamin members carry out active search of fever cases and ensure timely and appropriate diagnosis and treatment with the help of related Health Departments.

Accredited Social Health Activist(ASHA) training on Kala-Azar Elimination

ASHA training programme was held to build capacities of ASHA and sensitization on the needs of vulnerable communities and to plan ,implement and manage social mobilization And delivery of service through PPT by means of structured training and orientation session under the guidance of Manab Jamin and West Bengal Voluntary Health Association . The training was an immense support towards understanding the role and responsibilities of ASHA for Kala-Azar Elimination, Mr. Vivekananda Mondal, Vector Borne Disease consultant, Birbhum and Mr. Sajahan Ali, Kala-Azar Technical Supervisor Under Block Primary Health Centre gave a clear explanation on how to create awareness, mobilize, make village health plan and accompany the patient under Kala-Azar threat to the Hospital. 30 ASHA workers participated from different sub centers of Birbhum District.

Self Help Group.

Formation of Self Help groups is one of the major programmes of Manab Jamin. At present, total no of SHG's are under Manab Jamin 58. Among them 53 groups are for women and rest of 5 are for men. There have 629 members in all the Self Help Groups. All SHG have opened the bank account in Scheduled Banks. The members have deposited their contribution at the Schedule Bank and took the loan from the Scheduled Banks.

During this year Manab Jamin organized the value addition programme under Amla campaign programme for the members of SHG. Seventy two members of different SHG's have participated in this programme.

The members of SHG have taken Rs. 45, 42,450/- as loan. They have taken loan of Rs.11,81,850/- from their own contribution and Rs. 33,60,600/- from Scheduled Bank for small business, poultry, Animal husbandry, house repairing, handicraft work, treatment for illness, child education etc.

Manab Jamin Shishu Kendra

Manab Jamin has completed 18 years of its work at the backward areas of Birbhum District, West Bengal. The area is mainly inhabited by the members of Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribe. The members of this society are basically agricultural labourer and they go out for work in the morning and leaving young children in the hands of there older ones. The older children are expected to perform all the household activities during the daytime. The situation becomes acute during the time of sowing and harvesting when the demand for agricultural labour increases. We found that the rate of absence is increased during agriculture season. The project of Manab Jamin Shishu Kendra has been designed to cater to the educational needs of the children between the age group of 3-5 years. At present 8 MJSK are running at 8 villages under Manab Jamin Project Area.

The numbers of children in 8 MJSK are **222**. The details are given in a table as following:

The children are getting nutritious food for Health. Mother meetings had been held at their school on bi-monthly basis where they discussed about the progress of the children.. We keep records of weight and height of the children in their individual file at 3 months interval. At the end of the session, the teachers of MJSK took the initiative for admission of the children at the local primary schools. MJSK In Charge visits the school regularly.

Mothers Meeting

Every mothers meeting is very important to liaison with guardian / mothers of MJSK children. These meetings are held on every 2 months interval in each MJSK. There have been discussions on child care, child education, kitchen garden, food & nutrition, immunization, family planning, rules & regulation of the MJSK, health & hygiene, ICDP, etc. This year, 33 no of mother's meeting had been organized at eight no of MJSK, average 16 numbers of mother attend the mothers meeting, also each MJSk maintain record of attendance and other decision.

Committee Meeting

Every MJSK has own Local Committee, to look after the smooth running of the MJSK. The Committee members meet once in every quarter. There have been discussion on admission of new children in MJSK, admission of old children at local primary schools, collection of children contribution, solution of local problem related to MJSK. This year, 17 numbers of Committee meetings had been organized at eight MJSK, on an average 6 Committee members attend the meeting also each MJSK maintain own record of attendance and other decisions.

Home Visit

Home Visit is an important tool to run MJSK. All the teachers of the MJSK had visited the MJSK home once in every week. Rapport building is grown up between the teacher and parents as well as family members of the children through the Home-Visit. There have a personal interaction with the family members on kitchen garden, seed distribution, SHGs, health check up of children, queries about irregularity of children attendance and inform about the mothers meeting etc.

ECO Groups (Future Generation Farmers)

Ecological movement has been started under Manab Jamin since last eleven years. At present 11 eco groups are working actively at eleven villages of Manab Jamin. The idea to promote Eco Group at the age group of 11 to 18 yrs to create awareness against environment pollution and to grow habit for tree plantation to protect the environment. The members of Eco group are in the age group of 11 to 18 years and student from class VI to XII, the most of the eco-group members belong to farmers & day labourer family.

Apart from this, FGF members meet once in a week. They have conducted several survey related to environment and prepared chart & posters on this subject. They were also engaged in different social activities throughout the year. They participated in the programme of important days related to environment like Earth Day, World Environment Day, Meen Mangal Utsav, World Water Day, and World Forest Day etc.

Rural Knowledge Library (Direct Aid Programme)

During this year Manab Jamin had started a library and got support from Australian High Commission under Direct Aid Programme for the student of higher education from the under privilege section of Manab Jamin project area. There are many reference books for the students' .This library is equipped with Internet facilities along with Xerox Machine. The students will come as and when required and get the Internet facilities. The student as well as villagers will come to this library as and when required and use the references for higher studies.

National Child Labour Programme

During this year, Manab Jamin got sanction to run 2 nos. of NCLP Special School at Labpur and Hansra (Illambazar) from the Project Director, National Child Labour Programme of Birbhum. The children of the age group of 9 to 14 years especially child labour working in brick field or as a maid servant or working in a tea stall are the pupil of this special school. The objective of this programme is to combat child labour as well as to rehabilitate them in different trade. The capacity of the student of each school is 50. Each student gets regular mid-day meal and is allotted stipend of Rs.150 per month. The student would also acquire lesson on vocational training along with the regular course of study.

Education Support programme:

This is a regular programme of Manab Jamin where text books are distributed among schedule caste, schedule tribe, other backward class and economically weaker section student under Manab Jamin Project Area. During this year, 73 nos. of students from 13 villages got textbooks. They are studying from Class IX & X. This programme is partly supported by Direct Aid Programme of Australian High Commission.

One hundred and thirty (130) nos. of student from 28 villages had got textbook support from Manab Jamin during this year. They are studying from class XI & XII.

Forty seven (47) nos. of students from 14 villages got text book support. The students are from Vidya Bhavan under Visva Bharati University, Mayurakshi Gramin College under Sidhu Kanu University, Burdwan Raj College, Guskara Mahavidyalaya, Hetampur Krishna Chandra College, Bolpur College, Purnidevi Choudhury Girl's College, Kabi Joydev MahaVidyala, Chandidas College, Abhadanga College, and Rampurhat College under Burdwan University.

Observance of Important Days

Earth Day

Earth Day was observed on 22nd April 2013 at Kankutia village. 100 Eco Group members, SHG members and villagers have participated in this programme. The Project In-charge and other 2 members of Manab Jamin have spoke on the importance as well as significance of the day. There have been discussions on environment pollution, soil erosion and the different measures taken to protect environment pollution and soil erosion.

Meen Mangal Utsav

The programme was started by Late Pannalal Dasgupta. Every year, Manab Jamin organizes this programme.. On 15th September, 2013 the Meen Mangal Utsav was held at Supur at the bank of Ajoy River. 300 Eco Group Members, Future Generation Farmers Group, Youth Leaders, MJ members and guests had participated. Prof. Sakti Bhattacharya, Dr. (Mrs.) Madhusree Ghosh, Mr. Asok Ghosh spoke on the importance of the day. The Eco Group Members, Future Generation Farmers Group and Youth Leaders had performed a short cultural programme. At the end of this programme 2000 fishlings were released at the river Ajoy.

Observance of Manab Jamin Foundation Day

Manab Jamin had observed the 16th foundation day through a meeting at Manab Jamin Mirzapur Campus on 2nd October, 2013. All the members of Manab Jamin had participated in this programme. The members of Manab Jamin shared their ideas of the journey of sixteen years.

Observance of Ecological Group Day

Manab Jamin observed the day for Ecological Group (Eco Group) on 9th February 2014 at Manab Jamin campus. Members of the Future Generation Farmers' Group, Youth Leaders, villagers and guest participated in this programme. Sri. Saroj Roychoudhury and Sri. Mrinal Kanti Roychoudhury have spoken on the importance of Eco Groups in the present scenario. Eco Group members exhibited charts and posters on Climate Change and Water Conservation. Eco Group members performed a short cultural programme.
