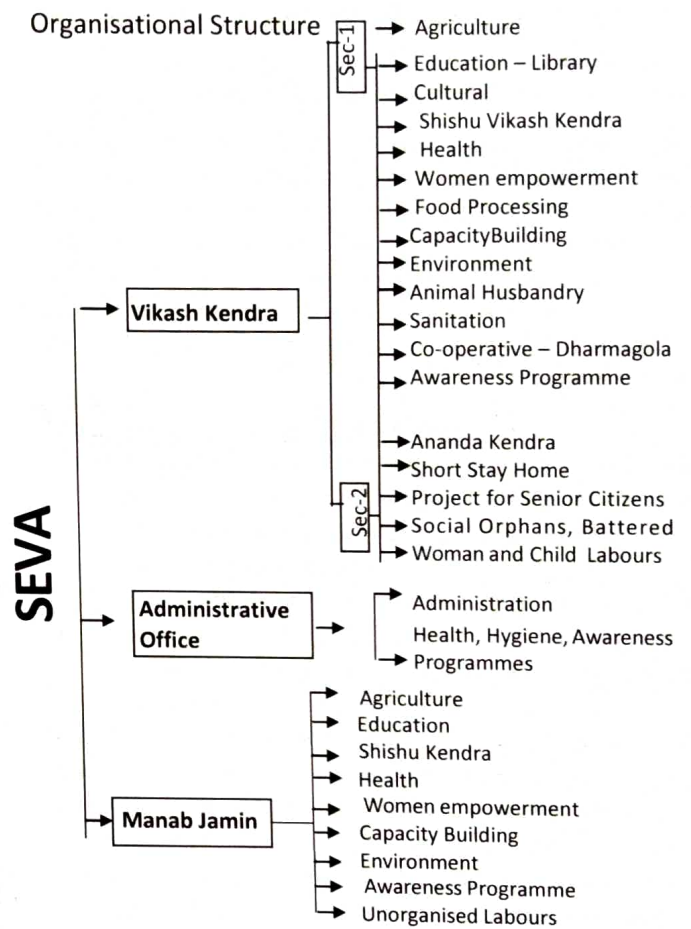

VIKAS KENDRA

Annual Report 2017-18

Vikas Kendra, the initial project of SEVA, started its journey in the year 1985 and for the last 33 years Vikas Kendra is working in the fields of Agriculture, with emphasis on organic agriculture; Health, Education, Women Empowerment, Environment, Capacity Building, National Integrity, SHGs etc based in Baduria block and also in the surrounding three blocks in the district of North 24 Parganas with various government and non-government agencies.

AGRICULTURE

SEVA from the very beginning is taking special care for promoting **Organic Agriculture**. The movement was initiated in 1991 in SEVA's own land of 10 bigha and in the land of 100 farmers of 10 villages and at present there are 849 farmers (149.2 ha. Land) who are under agreement with us to produce Jute, vegetables and field crops using only Organic manures and Organic pesticides to eradicate diseases caused due to inorganic pesticides. They are spread over 17 villages in Baduria and Deganga Block. Out of these farmers some of them are engaged in producing Phospho-compost, Vermi-compost, Liquid manure, Green manure for their own use. All the organic farmers are also engaged in making organic pesticides under our direction and guidance. Different training, awareness programme, seed distribution had been organized towards this

goal. Vikas Kendra developed some Indigenous Technology for the preparation of liquid manure for application on the crops, botanical pesticides for the control of pest and disease. Those are eco-friendly. In the last two years the government has also extended support for organic farming through their PKVY and bio-village programmes.

Organic Jute:

The organic Jute production initiated in the year 2006 with the help of Ganges Jute Mill is still continuing. 450 farmers are producing organic jute in 102 hec. land with the help of Ganges Jute Mill. They were provided with 550 Kg. seeds at free of cost. Gloster Limited started organic Jute cultivation collaboration with SEVA with 110 farmers at 27.6 hec. Land. This year 70 farmers and an area of 37.0 ha. land have been brought under this scheme. The farmers have been provided with 400 Kg. seeds at free of cost. This year the farmers could sell 309 MT of organic jute.

Enhancement of livelihood Security of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Farmers.

Since 2013 CRIJAF with the help of Vikas Kendra are working for livelihood development of 172 ST farmers of Pashchim Shimla, Dighir Paar. They are provided with different trainings, agricultural equipments, seeds, fertilizers enabling the respective families to come out of extreme poverty. Since 2017,

CRIJAF is extending similar assistance to 70 farmers of Dweep Media, Pingaleswar, Panji.

Organic Bazaar:

This organic Bazaar programme is functioning since last 16 years. One local Organic Bazaar is running at Atghara on every Monday and Friday to sell produce grown by the registered organic farmers. In addition, Organic Bazaars also have been organized by Pallisri seed corporation office, Kolkata. Moreover, the farmers are getting benefitted by selling organic produces at Baguihaty and Dumdum organic Bazaar. The Organic Bazar programme is supported by SEVA through our staff and Eco-volunteers.

Technology Transfer:

Vikas Kendra developed some Indigenous Technology for the preparation of liquid manure for application on the crops, botanical pesticides for the control of pest and disease. Those are eco-friendly.

The experts attached to SEVA conducted training programme at different places and displayed in the local exhibitions. To increase the Knowledge of Organic Farming of the students of BCKV, IGNOU an exposure visit programme had been introduced in the field of Organic Farms at Vikas Kendra led by Prof. Mahadev Pramanik, Training Coordinator, IGNOU. We

participated in the exhibitions/ trainings at Nagarukra Pushpa Mela, Bhandarkona Saraswati Puja, Sayestanagar Panchayat.

Farmers Awareness meeting/Training:

We organized 24 farmers meeting/training on Jute retting, Land preparation, Intenal Inspection, Vermi compost making, upgrading of organic agriculture, Bio-pesticide making, Crop planning and future of organic jute, use of CRIJAF Sona, use of IJIRA Subhra seeds. Presently 845 farmers are getting benefit of these matters.

Eco-Volunteer Meeting:

We organized 13 eco-volunteers meeting in this year on Organic vegetables marketing, compost making, bio—pesticides making, Proper Internal Inspection, Jute retting, Jute gradation, Crop Planning, Organic Standards, check list filling up and maintaining of farm diary.

Farmer's Day programme:

On 18.11.17 at the Titumeer Fair and on 25.09.17 at CRIJAF the farmers participated to attend farmer's day programme cum exposure visit.

DISTRICT AGRI MARKETING DEPARTMENT

Vikas Kendra this year distributed 12 van rickshaws and 7 Traditional Gola structure in our Project area with the help of Agriculture Marketing, Govt. of West Bengal.

PKVY (Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana)

Since March, 2015 with government assistance 100 farmers in the two clusters of Panji and Jangalpur have prepared Vermicompost pit and producing organic fertilizers. The farmers are producing organic vegetables and selling their products at four government outlets. This infrastructural facilities and higher rate of return have enhanced the interest of farmers for organic production.

Jute Retting

Since the farmers were not getting good yield of jute on indigenous method of production, hence on technical advice of CRIJAF and IJIRA we organized several awareness meeting, training on improved technology of cultivation. On using CRIJAF Sona powder in 630 retting, the farmers got jute fiber which is of one grade higher quality. 1242 farmers of 8 blocks under our project area used IJIRA Subhra and have produced jute fiber of one-two grade higher quality. This has enabled the farmers to earn Rs 400 – 800 more per quintal.

01.01.2018 – 21 Organic Farmers displayed their 42 Exhibits in the Nagar Ukhra Pushpa Mela. We conducted training cum awareness meeting for 56 farmers.

24.01.2018 – 55 Organic Farmers displayed 87 Exhibits in the Fair at Bhandarkona on the day of Saraswati Puja. Training cum awareness meeting was also conducted on the relevance of organic farming.

05.03.2018 – 07.03.2018 – at Uttar Jangalpur FP School and **12.03.2018 – 13.03.2018** – Pingaleswar FP School – PKVY Mela, supported by the government, was conducted by Vikas Kendra. Exhibition of agricultural produces, organic products, seminars, quiz and drawing competitions were organized in the fair.

HEALTH

To improve the health care system with the active involvement of all stakeholders concerned in Jasaikati-Atghara & Jadhurhati Uttar Gram Panchayat under Baduria Block, Vikas Kendra has been working for increasing the involvement of community people & various community groups for effective implementation of National Health Mission (NHM), which is under Basic Health Care & Support Programme. We got the support from MEMISA-DGD, Belgium & West Bengal Voluntary Health Association.

Vikas Kendra is the partner of North 24 Parganas District Health Forum. Health Forum has been working in North 24 Parganas

since 2006 for strengthening the Govt. Health System, ensuring the Health Rights, organizing CBOs/NGOs who are working in health field, Data sharing & Policy level Advocacy.

Supporting VHSNCs: (Village Health Sanitation & Nutrition Committee)

We organized 8 (eight) meetings for strengthening VHSNCs. Discussion on Village Survey, Resource Mapping, how to monitor Sub-centre, Anganwadi Centre, how to prepare village Health Plan and their roles & responsibilities under Basic Health Care & Support Programme.

We have done 2 numbers of Case Building exercise. It is a contemporary idea. Last few years we highlighted case study which was success story. But case building is a success & unsuccessful story. Case Building exercise has some steps. At first we have collected cases then analyzed that and find out the direct cause, indirect cause & stakeholders who are directly or indirectly involved with this case. After that we have prepared an Action Plan & Advocacy tools. According to this we have organized some programme.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

Titumeer Fair:

Titumeer is the 1st martyr in India's quest for freedom, who gave his life on 19th November, 1831, while defending his Bamboo Stockade. We organize an Annual Fair in his memory to spread the message of national integrity and development. As martyr Titumeer was son of the soil local population participates in thousands.

On 17.11.2017, 32nd Annual Titumeer Fair was inaugurated by Sri Tushar Singha, Chairman, Baduria Municipality and Sri Sujoy Banerjee, CDPO, Baduria ICDS Project. They delivered inaugural lecture about Saheed Mir Nisar Ali Titumeer and importance of Annual Titumeer Fair'17. After the inaugural session, the Block Level VHSNC Convention was held. GP Health Supervisor, ANM, ASHA, AWW & PRI members attended the programme. In the evening Ananda Kendra inmates presented Songs, Dance & Drama.

On 18.11.2017, 2nd Day of Titumeer Fair'17. We organised a Farmers Day meeting on organic cultivation. Kazi Abdur Rahim MLA, Baduria Block; Mrs Arun Das, SAO, Maldah; Dr. Abhijit Nandy, Dr, Mahadev Pramanik, Professors of BCKV and Sri Abdur Rahaman facilitated the programme.

We also organized Kabi Sammelan on that day. Poets from different areas of North 24 Parganas participated in the assembly. They recited their own poetries. Hazi Amir Ali facilitated the whole programme.

In the evening the main attractions were the performance of tribal dance group from Birbhum, famous Mime artist and Ventriloquist. Ananda Kendra inmates presented cultural programme.

On 19.11.17, 3rd Day of Titumeer Fair'17. In the morning a colourful procession was organized from Vikas Kendra to Narkelberia, the historic place which once contained the Bansher Kella of Shaheed Titumeer. A special sensitization meeting was organized regarding behavioral changes and problems of adolescents. We have also discussed about 'Annesha Clinic' which is a separate clinic of Block Primary Health Centre. Smt Ruma Chowdhury has facilitated this programme.

In memory of Saheed Mir Nisar Ali Titumeer Blood Donation Camp was held. 75 donors donated blood.

Consumer Affairs awareness training:

We organised one consumer awareness meeting on fair business, consumer court, Chit fund etc. at Titumeer Mela.

Library:

We have a library named, Shaheed Titumeer Public Library. The Library is a treasure house of 2350 books and magazines. All are welcome for library membership against a token subscription.

Food Processing Unit:

Food Processing Unit is running successfully by the initiative of Vikas Kendra. Different kinds of Jam, Jelly, Mango Pickle, Mustered Mango, Squash, Tomato Sauce, honey, multi-grain cereal (Sattoo), spices and mustard oil were produced through Food Processing Unit in the financial year 2017-18. These food products have been sold in the market in the brand name of Tripti. Economically weaker inmates of Ananda Kendra Home get some financial support from this Unit and day by day they are gaining efficiency.

SISHU VIKAS KENDRA

The objective of Sishu Vikas Kendra (SVK) is to impart pre-primary education to the distressed rural children and upgrade them mentally and prepare them to be able to sustain educational pressure for the next higher classes. We took up the work of Child Development Centre not as a base point of education but as the platform to start with building mental set up to hold basic responsibilities. Keeping it in point of view, our teachers are advised for taking care of SVK children and they are doing their best in doing so and at the same time developing hearty relationship between local youth and our centers. They arrange monthly meeting with the mothers and also arrange other awareness programmes for them. After completing pre-primary education, we take them for admission to the nearest primary school and private missionary schools. This year 10 children were enrolled in the local primary school.

Guardian Meeting:

Monthly meeting with the guardians of SVK children is a very important step in this direction. During this year 12 monthly guardian meetings took place in our SVK Centre. Subjects discussed in the meetings were on Child Care, Food & Nutrition, Kitchen Garden, Family Planning, Women Empowerment, Immunization, Discipline, First Aid, Utility of Medicinal Plants, Importance of Cleanliness and Child Education

Home Visit:

The teachers have done home visits to the houses of children of our SVKs. The main purpose of such visits was to ensure regular attendance of children in school and to have personal interaction with the mothers to share their family problems, discussion on improvement of health, ailments and the remedies with the family members.

Annual Sports:

Games and sports play important role in making body and mind health.. We organize annual sports every year for our SVK children and associate members. This year the event took place at Centre SVK on 5th January'2018. SVKs present and ex-students, their mothers and the committee members participated in the sports events.

Annual Picnic:

All the SVK children along with the teachers participated in the annual picnic held in 28th December'2017. Mothers and committee members also joined the happy occasion. The

programme was a source of fun, joy and a feeling of togetherness for the children.

Observation of Memorable Days:

Days of National importance and relevance in our life, Independence Day, Republic Day, Netaji's Birth Day, Rabindranath Tagore's Birth Day and Rakhi Bandhan Day were celebrated with great honour and respect.

DHARMAGOLA

Dharmagola is community grain storage, it was established in 1987. The concept of Dharmagola is "To Stop Distress Sale". When Marginal Farmers & Small Farmers are producing grain in their own fields, at that same time huge production prevail in the market. Then market price is down and middlemen take opportunity. To Stop Distress Sale we purchase the grain in that time at market price, from Marginal & Small Farmers. It is under Atghara Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited.

Dharmogola is an old concept to make a common warehouse based on trust and ethics. The concept was - when the price will go down the village products to be purchased by Dharmagola, when it will go up products to be sold with a better price. Profit will plough back to the producers. It is under supervision of Atghara Vikas Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited. Atghara Vikas Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited got the registration dated 13.03.2013 from ARCS office it is under Cooperative Society Registration act. We have started a Grocery

Shop from November'2013. Our Co-operative is going on and it has many more possibilities.

Kishori Shakti Yojona

Kishori Shakti Yojona (KSY), a programme of Government of west Bengal, seeks to empower adolescent girls, so as to enable them to take charge of their lives. It is viewed as a holistic initiative for the development of adolescent girls. The programme through its interventions aims at bringing about a difference in the lives of the adolescent girls. It seeks to provide them with an opportunity to realize their full potential.

We have successfully completed KISHORI SAKTI YOJONA (KSY) in 3(three) Blocks of North 24 Parganas. KISHORI SAKTI YOJONA (KSY) is being implemented in all the ICDS projects of the North 24 Pgs district with the aim to improve the nutritional & Health status of the adolescent girls (AG) and promoting self development, awareness of hygiene, nutrition, family welfare and management. The target group is all the adolescent girls in the age group of 11-18 years who are out of school and belonging to economically backward families in the community.

THE KEY FEATURES OF THE SCHEME ARE:

- 1) IFA and Bi-annual De-Warming through Weekly Iron Folic Acid Supplement
- 2) Quality health check –up on Village Health Nutrition Day
- 3) Mainstreaming of out of school AG'S of the age group 11-14 years.

- 4) Capacity building on life skill development, nutrition & health education & ARSH (Adolescent Reproductive & Sexual Health)
- 5) Exposure visit to public service like(Police Station, BDO etc)
- 6) Vocational training to the AG'S of the age group between 16-18 years.

Manab Jamin

Manab Jamin a project of Society for Equitable Voluntary Actions (SEVA) completed nearly twenty one years of developmental works in Bolpur-Sriniketan block of Birbhum district of West Bengal. Manab Jamin is now working at Bolpur-Sriniketan Block of Bolpur Sub-Division. The project area is rain-fed mostly mono-cropped and located at arid zone where the land is undulating consisting Red Laterite and Vindhya Alluvial soil. Rain is very unpredictable and it does not come when it is needed the most and comes when it's not expected. The temperature reaches to 46° C in the summer and drops down to 7° C in winter. Manab Jamin is largely working with Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and underprivileged section of people.

AGRICULTURE

Farmers' Field School

During this year, Manab Jamin organized Farmers' Field School at Paruldanga with the help of Assistant Director of Agriculture on Tori mustard cultivation. 30 farmers participated in this programme. A series of training were organized from sowing to harvesting of Tori mustard. Actually, it was an experiment on mustard cultivation. If farmers started to sow quite early, then, how the farmers would be benefitted. On participating in this programme, farmers got seeds, organic manure, seed treatment materials, Boron and Asphosphate to

reduce the Aphid etc and technical support from the department as and when required.

Demonstration of Mustard Tori Cultivation

Tori mustard is an important crop. It is used for oil as well as spices. The bi-product of Tori mustard is used as good manure as well as good feed for animals. During this year, Manab Jamin had demonstration of Tori Mustard cultivation with the help of Assistant Director of Agriculture, Bolpur-Sriniketan Block. 43 farmers of three villages had demonstrated in 50 bighas of land and cultivated 39 kgs seeds. Every farmer got 700 gms seeds per bigha.

Onion cultivation in winter season

During this year, 1 no of 4 -days unorganized sector worker have been organized with the help of "Dutta Pant Thangedi National Board for workers' Education" at Rathindrapally. 40 women from 40 families participated in the programme from 27.01.18 to 30.01.18. Upa-Pradhan of Respective Gram Panchayet, Members of Bolpur- Sriniketan Panchayet Samity, Additional Inspector of Back Warded classes Welfare, Birbhum District, Assistant Director of Agriculture, Bolpur-Sriniketan Block, Women Development Officer of Labhpur Block and MJ

members were the key note speaker during this training programme. There have been discussion on different schemes for their welfare, different health facilities, pension and provident fund schemes.

Self Help Group

Self Help group is one of the major programmes of Manab Jamin. At present, total number of SHG under Manab Jamin are 77. Among them 62 groups are for women and rest of 15 are for men. There are total 818 members in all the Self Help Groups. There are 179 ST members, 342 SC members, 15 backward class, 145 minority and 137 general members engaged in these groups. All SHG have opened their bank accounts in scheduled bank. The members have deposited their contribution at the schedule bank and taken loan there from. The members of SHG have availed loan from their own contributions as well as from scheduled bank for small business, poultry, animal husbandry, house repairing, handicraft work, treatment for illness, education for children etc.

This training programme was organized by Rathindra Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Visva-Bharati. Through this training programme, the participants acquired the idea on making bag by nylon cord.

Training on Incense Stick Making

During this year, 25 women members of Self Help Group participated in 5 days long training on Incense stick making. This training programme was organized by Rathindra Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Visva-Bharati.

EDUCATION

Manab Jamin Shishu Kendra

Manab Jamin has completed 20 years of its work at the backward areas of Birbhum District, West Bengal. The area is mainly inhabited by the members of Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribe. The members of this society are basically agricultural labourer and they go out for work in the morning leaving young children in the hands of older ones. The project of Manab Jamin Shishu Kendra has been designed to cater to the educational needs of the children between the age group of 3 – 5 years. At present 5 MJSK are running at 5 villages under Manab Jamin Project Area where 116 numbers of children are studying. *The details are as following :*

Mothers' Meeting

Mothers' meetings had been held at their school on bi-monthly basis where they discussed about the progress of the children. We keep records of weight and height of the children in their individual file at 3 months interval. At the end of the session, the teachers of MJSK take the initiative for admission of the children at the local primary school. The Project In charge visits the school regularly. Every mothers' meeting is very important to liaison with guardian / mothers of MJSK children. These meetings are held on every 2 months interval in each MJSK. There are discussions on child care, child education, kitchen garden, food & nutrition, immunization, family planning, rules & regulation of the MJSK, health & hygiene, ICDP, etc. This year, 23 number of mothers' meeting had been organized at 5 MJSKs.

Committee Meeting

Every MJSK has own local committee, to look after the smooth running of the MJSK. The committee members meet once in every quarter. They discuss on admission of new children in

MJSK, admission of old children at local primary school, collection of children contribution, solution of local problem related to MJSK. This year, 13 numbers of committee meeting had been organized at five MJSK.

Home Visit

Home Visit is an important tool to run MJSK. All the teachers of the MJSK visit the home of the students of MJSK once in every week. Rapport building is grown up between the teacher and parents as well as family members of the children through the Home-Visits through personal interaction with the family members on kitchen garden, seed distribution, SHGs, health check up of children, queries about irregularity of children attendance and inform about the mothers meeting etc.

Annual Sports

This year, we organized annual sports for the students of MJSK. at Manab Jamin Campus, Nurpur Ambagan Gram Unnayan Samity and Bahadurpur club.

Prof. Sundargopal Biswas Education Support Programme.

This is a regular programme of Manab Jamin where text books are distributed among schedule caste, schedule tribe, other backward class and economically weaker section students under Manab Jamin Project Area. The family members of Prof. Sundar Gopal Biswas had supported this programme to carry out the education among the students of underprivileged section of the society in memory of Prof. Sundar Gopal Biswas.

During this year, 41 numbers of students from 12 villages got textbooks. They are studying from Class IX & X. 43 students from class XI & XII of 11 villages got textbooks.

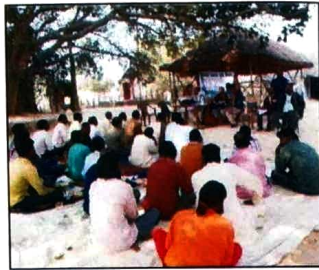

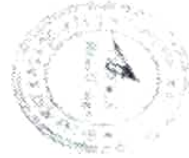
