VIKAS KENDRA

Annual Report 2018-19

Vikas Kendra, the initial project of SEVA, started its journey in the year 1985 and for the last 34 years Vikas Kendra is working in the fields of Agriculture, with emphasis on organic agriculture; Health, Education, Women Empowerment, Environment, Capacity Building, National Integrity, SHGs etc based in Baduria block and in the surrounding three blocks in the district of North 24 Parganas with various government and non-government agencies.

AGRICULTURE

SEVA from the very beginning is taking special care for promoting **Organic Agriculture**. The movement was initiated in 1991 in SEVA's own land 0f 10 bigha and in the land of 100 farmers of 10 villages and at present there are 950 farmers (192.52 ha. Land) who are under agreement with us to produce jute, vegetables and field crops using only Organic manures and Organic pesticides to eradicate diseases caused due to inorganic pesticides. They are spread over 17 villages in Baduria and Deganga Block. Out of these farmers some are engaged in producing Phospho-compost, Vermi-compost, Liquid manure, Green manure for their own use. All the organic farmers are also engaged in making organic pesticides

under our direction and guidance. Different trainings, awareness programmes, seed distribution had been organized towards this goal. Vikas Kendra developed some Indigenous Technology for the preparation of liquid manure for application on the crops, botanical pesticides for the control of pest and disease. Those are eco-friendly. In the last few years the government has also extended support for organic farming through their PKVY and biovillage programmes.

Organic Jute:

The Organic Jute production initiated in the year 2006 with the help of Ganges Jute Mill is still continuing. 450 farmers are producing organic jute in 102 hec. land with the help of Ganges Jute Mill. They were provided with 550 Kg. seeds at free of cost.

Gloster Limited started organic Jute cultivation in collaboration with SEVA with 110 farmers at 27.6 hec. Land. Last year 90 farmers and an additional area of 37.0 ha. land and this year 100 farmers and an area of 19.83 ha. land have been brought under this scheme. The farmers have been provided with 450 Kg. seeds at free of cost. This year the farmers could sell 254.3 MT of organic iute.

<u>Enhancement of livelihood Security of Scheduled</u> Caste and Scheduled Tribe Farmers.

Since 2013 CRIJAF with the help of Vikas Kendra are working for livelihood development of 172 ST farmers of Pashchim Shimla, Dighir Paar. They are provided with different trainings, agricultural equipments, seeds, fertilizers

enabling the respective families to come out of extreme poverty. Since 2017, CRIJAF is extending similar assistance to 70 SC farmers of Dweep Media, Pingaleswar, Panji. This Year BCKV extended assistance for Maize cultivation to 35 ST farmers of Dighir Para, Makhaltala and Ghoshpur village.

Organic Bazaar:

This organic Bazaar programme is functioning since last 17 years. One local Organic Bazaar is running at Atghara on every Monday and Friday to sell produces grown by the registered organic farmers. In addition, Organic Bazaars also have been organized by Pallisri Seed Corporation and Sonarpur Organic Bazar Kolkata. Moreover, the farmers are getting benefitted by selling organic produces at Baguihati and Dumdum organic Bazaar. The Organic Bazar programme is supported by SEVA through our staff and Eco-volunteers.

Technology Transfer:

Vikas Kendra developed some Indigenous Technology for the preparation of liquid manure for application on the crops, botanical pesticides for the control of pest and diseases. Those are eco-friendly.

The experts attached to SEVA conducted training programme at different places and displayed in the local exhibitions. To increase the Knowledge of Organic Farming of the students of BCKV, IGNOU an exposure visit programme had been introduced in the field of Organic Farms at Vikas Kendra led by Prof. Mahadev Pramanik, Training Coordinator, IGNOU. We participated in the exhibitions/ trainings at Nagarukra Pushpa Mela,

Bhandarkona Saraswati Puja, Sayestanagar Panchayat.

Farmers Awareness meeting/Training:

We organized 24 farmers' meeting/trainings on Jute retting, Land preparation, Internal Inspection, Vermi compost making, upgrading of organic agriculture, Biopesticide making, Crop planning and future of organic jute, use of CRIJAF Sona, use of IJIRA Subhra. Presently 1556 farmers are getting benefit of these matters.

Eco-Volunteer Meeting:

We organized 13 eco-volunteers meetings in this year on Organic vegetables marketing, compost making, bio—pesticides making, Proper Internal Inspection, Jute retting, Jute gradation, Crop Planning, Organic Standards, check list filling up and maintaining of farm diary.

Farmers' Day programme:

On 18.11.18 at the Titumeer Fair and on 25.09.18 at CRIJAF the farmers participated to attend farmers' day programme cum exposure visit.

DISTRICT AGRI MARKETING DEPARTMENT

Vikas Kendra this year distributed 07 van rickshaws and 5 Traditional Gola structure in our Project area with the help of Agriculture Marketing, Govt. of West Bengal.

PKVY (Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana)

Since March, 2015 with government assistance 100 farmers in the two clusters of Panji and Jangalpur have prepared Vermi-compost pit and producing organic fertilizers. The farmers are producing organic vegetables and selling their products at four government outlets. This infrastructural

facilities and higher rate of return have enhanced the interest of farmers for organic production.

Jute Retting

Since the farmers were not getting good yield of jute on indigenous method of production, hence on technical advice of CRIJAF and IJIRA we organized several awareness meetings, trainings on improved technology of cultivation. On using CRIJAF Sona powder in 1524 retting, the farmers got jute fiber which is of one grade higher quality. 1556 farmers of 12 blocks under our project area used IJIRA Subhra and have produced jute fiber of one-two grade higher quality. This has enabled the farmers to earn Rs 400 – 800 more per quintal.

Exhibition

17.11.2018 to 19.11.2018 – Exhibition of Organic Vegetables in Titumeer Fair. To encourage the farmers, three farmers were awarded for their produces.

01.01.2019 – 19 Organic Farmers displayed their 39 Exhibits in the Nagar Ukhra Pushpa Mela. We conducted training cum awareness meeting for 52 farmers.

10.02.2019 – 45 Organic Farmers displayed 79 Exhibits in the Fair at Bhandarkona on the day of Saraswati Puja. Training cum awareness meeting was also conducted on the relevance of organic farming.

HEALTH

To improve the health care system with the active involvement of all stakeholders concerned simultaneously in Jasaikati-Atghara, Jadhurhati Uttar and Chandipur

Gram Panchayat under Baduria Block and Sadhanpur, Chandigarh Gram Panchayet under Amdanga Block, Vikas Kendra has been working for increasing the involvement of community people & various community groups for effective implementation of National Health Mission (NHM), which is under Basic Health Care & Support Programme. We got the support from MEMISA-DGD, Belgium & West Bengal Voluntary Health Association.

Vikas Kendra is the partner of North 24 Parganas District Health Forum. Health Forum has been working in North 24 Parganas since 2006 for strengthening the Govt. Health System, ensuring the Health Rights, organizing CBOs/NGOs who are working in health field, Data sharing & Policy level Advocacy.

<u>Supporting VHSNCs: (Village Health Sanitation & Nutrition Committee)</u>

We organized 8 (eight) meetings for strengthening VHSNCs. Discussion on Village Survey, Resource Mapping, how to monitor Sub-centres, Anganwadi Centres, how to prepare village Health Plan and their roles & responsibilities under Basic Health Care & Support Programme.

At first we have collected cases then analyzed that and found out the direct cause, indirect cause & stakeholders who are directly or indirectly involved with this case. After that we have prepared an Action Plan & Advocacy tools. According to this we have organized some programme.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

<u>Titumeer Fair:</u>

Titumeer is the 1st martyr in India's quest for freedom, who gave his life on 19th November, 1831, while defending his Bamboo Stockade. We organize an Annual Fair in his memory to spread the message of national integrity and development. As martyr Titumeer was son of the soil local population participates in thousands.

On 17.11.18 1st day of 33rd Annual Titumeer Fair'18 Inauguarated by Sri Tribhuban Nath, BDO, Baduria & Sri Asok Ghosh, Founder SEVA. Sri Tapas Mukherjee and Sri Enamul Haque gave lecture about Saheed Mir Nissar Ali Titumeer and importance of Annual Titumeer Fair'18. After the inaugural session we also organised a discussion on importance of Sustainable Agriculture, facilitated by Sri Arun Das, SAO, Govt. of West Bengal. In the afternoon the Chhou Group of Sri Magaram Mahato, "KUDLUNG BASTI MADHURAY SMRITI CHHOU NITY SAMITI' from Purulia performed Chhou dance. This programme was organised with the help of EZCC. In the evening Ananda Kendra inmates performed Songs & Drama.

On 18.11.18 2nd Day of Annual Titumeer Fair'18, we organised Free Medical Camp on Eye & ENT. Doctors came from Eye Care & Research Centre and Rotary Kolkata. 60 Eye Patients and 60 ENT Patients attended this camp. We also organised Kabi Sammelon. Poets came from different area of North 24 Parganas district and also from Bangladesh. They recited their own compositions. Hazi Amir Ali facilitated the whole programme. In the evening Ananda Kendra inmates presented Songs & Mime. Kanchrapara Pathasena performed theatre. Sri Achin Goswami and his team showed mime, harbola and magic.

On 19.11.18, 3rd Day of Titumeer Fair'18. In the morning a colourful procession was organized from Vikas Kendra to Narkelberia, the historic place of the Bansher Kella of Shaheed Titumeer.

We observed this day as "SEVA Dibas". In memory of Saheed Mir Nissar Ali Titumeer, as every year, we organised Blood Donation Camp. 60 donors donated blood.

Library:

We have a library named Shaheed Titumeer Public Library. The Library is a treasure house of 2350 books and magazines. All are welcome for library membership against a token subscription.

Food Processing Unit:

Food Processing Unit is running successfully by the initiative of Vikas Kendra. Different kinds of Jam, Jelly, Mango Pickle, Mustered Mango, Squash, Tomato Sauce, honey, multi-grain cereal (Sattoo), spices and mustard oil were produced through Food Processing Unit in the financial year 2017-18. These food products have been sold in the market with the brand name of Tripti. Economically weaker women of the village and inmates of Ananda Kendra Home get some financial support from this Unit.

SISHU VIKAS KENDRA

The objective of Sishu Vikas Kendra (SVK) is to impart preprimary education to the distressed rural children and upgrade them mentally and prepare them to be able to sustain educational pressure for the next higher classes. We took up the work of Child Development Centre not as a base point of education but as the platform to start with building mental set up to hold basic responsibilities. Keeping it in point of view, our teachers are advised for taking care of SVK children and they are doing their best in doing so and at the same time developing hearty relationship between local youth and our centers. They arrange monthly meeting with the mothers and also arrange other awareness programmes for them. After completing pre-primary education, we take them for admission to the nearest primary school and private missionary schools. This year 10 children were enrolled in the local primary school.

Guardian Meeting:

Monthly meeting with the guardians of SVK children is a very important step in this direction. During this year 12 monthly guardian meetings took place in our SVK Centre. Subjects discussed in the meetings were on Child Care, Food & Nutrition, Kitchen Garden, Family Planning, Women Empowerment, Immunization, Discipline, First Aid, Utility of Medicinal Plants, Importance of Cleanliness and Child Education.

Home Visit:

The teachers have done home visits to the houses of children of our SVKs. The main purpose of such visits was to ensure regular attendance of children in school and to have personal interaction with the mothers to share their family problems, discussion on improvement of health, ailments and the remedies with the family members.

Annual Sports:

Games and sports play important role in making healthy body and mind. We organize annual sports every year for our SVK children and associate members. This year the event took place at the Centre of SVK on 13th January'2019. Present and ex-students of SVK, their mothers and the committee members participated in the sports events.

Annual Picnic:

All the SVK children along with the teachers participated in the annual picnic held in 28th December'2018. Mothers and committee members also joined the happy occasion. The programme was a source of fun, joy and a feeling of togetherness for the children.

Observation of Memorable Days:

Days of National importance and relevance in our life, Independence Day, Republic Day, Netaji's Birth Day, Rabindranath Tagore's Birth Day and Rakhi Bandhan Day were celebrated with great honour and respect.

DHARMAGOLA

Dharmagola is community grain storage, it was established in 1987. The concept of Dharmagola is "To Stop Distress Sale". When Marginal Farmers & Small Farmers are producing grain in their own fields, at that same time huge production prevail in the market. Then market price is down and middlemen take opportunity. To Stop Distress Sale we purchase the grain in that time at market price, from Marginal & Small Farmers. It is under Atghara Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited.

Dharmogola is an old concept to make a common warehouse based on trust and ethics. The concept was - when the price will go down the village products to be purchased by Dharmagola, when it will go up products to be sold with a better price. Profit will plough back to the producers. It is under supervision of Atghara Vikas Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited. Atghara Vikas Consumer's Cooperative Society Limited got the registration dated 13.03.2013 from ARCS office it is under Cooperative Society Registration act. We have started a

Grocery Shop from November'2013. Our Co-operative is going on and it has many more possibilities.

ANANDA KENDRA HOME

Ananda Kendra, the Centre of Joy has been established in 1993 and is functional since 1995. The Senior Citizens, Social Orphans, Battered Women and Child Labours are main participants of this project. We have started and continuing this experiment for restoring these unfortunate sections of our society to road to life.

At present Swadhar Greh project of Department of Women & Child Development, Govt of India and Dte. Of Social Welfare, Govt. of West Bengal for shelter and rehabilitation of the destitute women along with their children, if any, and Child Care Institute of Dept. of Women & Child Development, Govt. of india and Dte. Of Social Welfare, Govt. of West Bengal for protection and care of the girls below 18 years of age are functioning under Ananda Kendra Home.

There is a comprehensive plan for all round development of these people. Building up of awareness and consciousness about the different issues including world environment is very important step towards that end. We observe the various days of importance and significance with active participation of the inmates. The following is the details.

Days of National Importance and days of festivities are also observed with due enthusiasm by the inmates of Ananda Kendra. Our patrons and residents of our village also attended the programmes to encourage the inmates.

She was unable to speak; could not hear; had mental challenges. She was rescued by police and was admitted to our Swadhar Greh for shelter in August 2018. Fortunately she had her identity card but primarily the address was not traceable. We are happy that after four months' sincere effort of our staff and one social worker of Atghara with the help of social network, she was restored to her family staying in a remote

village of Bihar. The tears of happiness of the reunited family were our reward.

Manab Jamin a project of Society for Equitable Voluntary Actions (SEVA) completed nearly twenty one years of developmental works in Bolpur - Sriniketan block of Bolpur Sub-Division of Birbhum district of West Bengal. The project area is rain-fed, mostly mono-cropped and located at arid zone where the land is undulating consisting Red Laterite and Vindhya Alluvial soil. Rain is very unpredictable and it does not come when it is needed the most and comes when it's not expected. The temperature reaches to 46° C in the summer and drops down to 7° C in winter. Manab Jamin is largely working with Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and under privileged section of people.

AGRICULTURE

Farmers' Field School

During this year, Manab Jamin had organized Farmers' Field School at Paruldanga with the help of Assistant Director of Agriculture on Sahabhagi Paddy in the field of Tori mustard cultivation. 30 farmers participated in this programme. A series of training had been organised from sowing to harvesting of Sahabhagi paddy. To participate in this programme, farmers got seeds, organic manure, seed treatment materials, Boron etc and technical

support from the department as and when required. Due to insufficient rain, the farmers would not get fruitful result to practice this experiment.

Demonstration of Mustard Cultivation

During this year, Manab Jamin had demonstration of Mustard cultivation with the help of Assistant Director of Agriculture, Bolpur-Sriniketan Block. 20 farmers of two villages had demonstrated in 20 bighas of land and cultivated 20 kg seeds. Every farmer got 1kg of seed per bigha. The average production of mustard is nearly 55 kg/bigha.

<u>Mushroom Demonstration programme</u>

During this year, Manab Jamin organized 2 no. of training programmes on mushroom cultivation. 40 women participated in this

training programme at Islampur, Binuria. There has been discussion on package of practice on mushroom cultivation programme, process of cultivation, etc. There have been discussions also on importance of intake of

mushroom in regular food habit.

EDUCATION

Manab Jamin Shishu Kendra

Manab Jamin has completed 21 years of its work at the backward areas of Birbhum District, West Bengal. The area

is mainly inhabited by the members of Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribe. The members of this society are basically agricultural labourer and they go out for work in the morning leaving young children in the hands of there older ones. The older children are expected to perform all the household activities during the daytime. The situation becomes acute during the time of sowing and harvesting when the demand for agricultural labour increases. We found that the rate of absence of parents is increased during this season. The project of Manab Jamin Shishu Kendra has been designed to cater to the educational needs of the children between the age group of 3 - 5 years. At present 6 MJSKs are running at 6 villages under Manab Jamin Project Area where 159 nos. of children are studying. Out of these centres the MJSK Binuria has been initiated in this year with support of Sinthi Alokbortika. Prof. Debiprasanna Mukhopadhyay, Former Principal, Vinaya Bhaban, Visva-Bharati University, inaugurated the centre on 2nd October, 2018 at Binuria. The other 5 MJSKs have received grants for upgradation from Aiducatenow, California.

Mothers' Meeting

Mothers' meetings are very important to liaison with guardian / mothers of MJSK children. Mothers meetings are held at respective schools on bi-monthly basis where they discussed about the progress of the children. We keep records of weight and height of the children in their individual file at 3 months interval. At the end of the session, the teachers of MJSK took the initiative for admission of the children at the local primary school. The Project In charge visits the school regularly.

In these bi-monthly meetings there are discussions on child care, child education, kitchen garden, food & nutrition, immunization, family planning, rules & regulation of the MJSK, health & hygiene, ICDP, etc. This year, 27 no. of mothers' meetings had been organized at 5 no of MJSK,

Committee Meeting

Every MJSK have own local committee, to look after the smooth running of the MJSK. The committee members meet once in every quarter. They discussed on admission of new children in MJSK, admission of old children at local

primary school, collection of contribution, solution of local problem related to MJSK. This year, 14 no of committee meeting had been organized at five numbers of MJSK.

Home Visit

Home Visit is an important tool to run MJSK. All the teachers of the MJSK visit the home of the children of MJSK once in every week. Rapport building is grown up between the teacher and parents as well as family members of the children through the Home-Visit. There are personal interactions with the family members on kitchen garden, seed distribution, SHGs, health check-up of children, queries about irregularity of attendance of the chilldren and information about the mothers meeting etc.

Annual Sports

This year, we organized annual sports for all the students of MJSK. This sports had been organized at five different places viz. at Manab Jamin Campus, Mirjapur; Nurpur Ambagan Gram Unnayan Samity; Supur, Bahadurpur and Binuria club. The children are happy to participate in annual sports.

<u>Prof. Sundargopal Biswas Education Support</u> <u>Programme</u>

This is a regular programme of Manab Jamin where text books are distributed among schedule caste, schedule tribe, other backward class and economically weaker section students under Manab Jamin Project Area. The family members of Prof. Sundar Gopal Biswas had supported this programme to carry out education among the students of underprivileged section of the society in memory of Prof. Sundar Gopal Biswas. During this year, 38 nos. of students from 12 villages got textbooks. They are studying from Class IX & X. 43 students from class XI & XII of 11 villages got textbooks.
